

Neighbourhood Improvement Fund Funding Guide

Purpose of the fund	Using money collected from developers, Crawley Borough Council created the
	Neighbourhood Improvement Fund. Projects should focus on the provision,
	improvement, replacement, operation, or maintenance of infrastructure; or
	anything else that is concerned with addressing the demands that development
	places on an area.
Are you Eligible?	To be eligible for this fund your organisation must:
	Be run by community organisations, charities or social enterprises/ not
	for profit organisations.
	• Have a governing document (constitution, set of rules or equivalent)
	that show how your group or organisation is run and managed.
	• Have a bank or building society account in the name of the group, with
	a minimum of two cheque signatures.
	• Have an equal opportunities and diversity policy covering the
	organisation and activity (which says that you will not discriminate on
	specific grounds).
	• Have an annual income or expenditure of less than £10 Million.
	Project must take place in Crawley.

are we interested in	 Accessibility Projects and Improvements – i.e., making a community

	Turning waste space into community areas
	• Improvements to Community Buildings/ resident facilities in shared
	spaces
	Community Art projects – Murals, Sculpture etc.
	• Community Safety Projects – improvements to lighting, landscaping
	etc.
	Energy Efficiency initiatives
	 Improvements supporting wildlife and green spaces.
	 Non-physical play (e.g., painted games on courtyards)
	 Physical equipment in community spaces – play parks, outdoor gyms
	etc.
	 Planting improvements – wildflowers and trees
	Recycling projects
	 Social Enterprises to monetise waste products – generating income
	through waste product innovation.
	 Sustainable services for those with more specific needs
	Crawley Borough Council will not pledge towards projects that:
	Help only one individual.
	Do not promote community cohesion.
	Are one off events.
	 Are managed by groups that have had a previous grant which has not
	been managed satisfactorily.
	 Are raising funds for works or equipment already committed, bought,
	or completed (including trips).
	 Solely benefit people who live outside of Crawley.
	 Include administration costs, general running / revenue costs.
	 Include volunteer costs/ expenses.
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	Include rent/ hire charges.
	 Include unspecified expenditure (e.g., campaign with flexible funding)
	Promote a specific political party or faith.
	Interfere with Council business.
	• Place an unauthorised financial implication on the Council.
	Crawley Borough Council reserves the right to not fund a project or to withdraw
	funding if it becomes apparent that any of the criteria are not being met.
What are the criteria?	 Projects must benefit the people of Crawley. Priority will be given to the following:
	 Helps improve the local environment and public spaces.
	 Helps meet the demands that development places on the need
	for community services and facilities within the town.
	\circ Demonstrates added benefits for the town, e.g., using local
	businesses or skills of local people.
	 Has a lasting impact on the local area and local people
Awarding Funds	The Neighbourhood Improvement Fund is intended to support small local
	projects. Project proposals can request a minimum of £1,000 and up to a
	maximum £5,000.
Assessing you	The Council assessment process will consider the following:
application	• The extent to which it benefits the people of Crawley.
	Consideration will also be given to
	• The amount of development that has taken place in the area.
	• Ensuring the applicant organisation meets the eligibility criteria.
	• Establishing if the application for which funding is sought is suitable to
	be funded under this programme and is consistent with the expressed
	purpose of the fund.
	• Considering if the application is clear as to what is being asked for and
	testing that costings are accurate, appropriate and represent value for
	money.
	 Considering the difference, the activity will make within the context of the local community.
Payment	the local community. For successful applications, payment will be made by BACS transfer into your
arrangements	nominated bank account within ten working days of the relevant Council
anangements	decision.
Monitoring	You will be required to provide evidence to demonstrate the successful
requirements	delivery or completion of your funded project. Failure to do so could lead to
	the Council taking steps to reclaim the funding from you.
