Introduction

Crawley Borough Council (CBC) is pleased to bring forward draft concept proposals to physically transform the public spaces on the Martlets, Haslett Avenue West and Friary Way, and deliver major improvements to the operation of the bus station in the heart of Crawley town centre. These proposals represent phase one of the "Station Gateway" scheme, known as such because of its proximity to Crawley railway station - a major gateway into Crawley which has recently seen major investment from Network Rail in a modernised station facility.

These proposals are deliverable thanks to government and local authority capital funding allocated from a combination of - the Crawley Growth Programme and the Crawley Towns Fund. Further details about these funds can be found on the Crawley Borough Council web site. crawley.gov.uk

This is just the first phase in an ambitious plan, driven by the Council's Town Centre Regeneration Programme, to attract tens of millions of pounds of private investment in new residential, retail, and commercial development in the Station Gateway area, generating hundreds of new homes and jobs, which benefit Crawley residents.

The Council is committed to progressing the proposals in close dialogue with key stakeholders, including West Sussex County Council, Metrobus, Network Rail, Arora Group, the Crawley Town Centre Business Improvement District and County Mall.


What: The Proposals

Phase 1 of the Station Gateway scheme is a proposed £7.4 million investment to:

- Refresh and regenerate the Martlets pedestrian zone
- Increase the pedestrian thoroughfare on Haslett Avenue West and improve its quality
- Improve the Bus Station and its layout on Friary Way, expanding the pedestrian paving;
- Reconfigure the Station Way / Friary Way road junction and pedestrian crossings
- Enhance cycle route connectivity to the bus station
- Prepare for future phases of the Station Gateway scheme and further funding bids to the government for significant new bus infrastructure at the bus station and on Station Way.

Why: The Benefits

- Provide physical improvements to the public spaces on Friary Way, the Martlets and Haslett Avenue West, creating a better-connected transport hub for pedestrians and cyclists between the railway station, bus station and the wider town centre
- Deliver an enhanced bus station with improved bus and traffic flows around Friary Way including a dedicated left-hand turn for buses from Friary Way onto Station Way
- Upgrade, reconfigure and maximise bus operational capacity within the bus station to boost the successful provision of bus services across the town
- Improve the efficiency of bus movements, whilst also upholding the safety of more vulnerable road users
- Improve the experience of bus passengers using the bus station
- Provide high quality, distinctive and enjoyable public spaces for residents, visitors and town centre workers, boosting footfall and vitality in the town centre and encouraging a stronger sense of place
- Add quality soft landscaping to the space with a variety of planting and greenery to soften the appearance of the area and enhance the quality of the environment
- Provide continuous and safe cyclist access to the edge of the pedestrian-only core shopping area and to the wider cycle network
- Ensure the space is accessible to all users including children, older people, people with disabilities, workers, residents, and visitors who will be using the space at different times of the day and night
- Provide continuity with other successfully delivered improvement schemes in Crawley town centre including Queens Square / Queensway, The Boulevard and Eastern Gateway
- Transform the living and working environment to help unlock prestigious private sector investment and development including high-quality new residential accommodation, and new business and retail space.

STATION GATEWAY - PHASE 2 VISUALS - BUS ISLAND CANOPY (Subject to Funding)

The Council has ambitious plans to deliver further major bus station infrastructure improvements, working closely with West Sussex County Council, Metrobus and the Department for Transport.

The below draft 'Phase 2' images outline our aspirations to secure significant future funding from the government to unlock investment in a new bus station canopy structure as a centrepiece on the proposed bus island.

The canopy structure, which is illustrated indicatively on these images, will form part of a separate phase of work, subject to the required further funding being secured.
