

## Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

- 1 If this premises licence authorises the supply/sale of alcohol, the following two conditions apply:
  - i. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or at a time when the designated supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
  - ii. Every supply/sale of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 2 If this premises licence authorises the exhibition of film(s), the admission of children under the age of 18 years is restricted in accordance with the age restrictions of the British Board of Film Classification (BBFC) or authority designated under Section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984.
- 3 If this premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity (as defined by the Private Security Industry Act 2001) then such individuals must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

#### (Conditions 4 to 6 effective from 6<sup>t</sup> April 2010 – Sch 4 Policing & Crime Act 2010)

4 (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children–

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-

- (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply Alcohol), or
- (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
- (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on-
  - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
  - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 5 The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 6 The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

(Conditions 7 & 8 effective from 1<sup>st</sup>October 2010 – Sch 4 Policing & Crime Act 2010)

- 7 (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
  - (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 8 The responsible person shall ensure that-
  - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-
    - (i) beer or cider:  $\frac{1}{2}$  pint;
    - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
    - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
  - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

## Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- Noise from regulated entertainment shall be inaudible within any noise sensitive premises (this includes any residents which may have one or more windows open to allow for ventilation). The test for fulfilment for this condition shall be that noise from this premises shall be no more than barley audible at the boundary of any nearby noise sensitive premises.
- 2) On each day that regulated entertainment takes place the premises supervisor shall ensure that the test for fulfilment for this condition takes place on at least two occasions
- 3) Doors and windows shall be kept shut at all times that regulated entertainment is taking place except as

required for access. (Emergency escape routes must not be locked)

- 4) Prominent clear and legible signage shall be displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the rights of local residents to a peaceful night and to leave premises and the area quietly. Announcements to the same effect shall be made to patrons at appropriate times.
- 5) A prominent clear and legible sign shall be displayed within the premises stating that the premises supervisor will ban from the premises any persons who regally leave in a noisily fashion.
- 6) Any person exercising a security activity (as defined by paragraph 2(1)(a) of Schedule 2 of the Private Security Industry Act 2001) shall be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
- 7) Any person as defined in condition (6) will clearly display his name badge at all times whilst on duty.
- 8) Such a person will be employed at the premises at the discretion of the designated premises supervisor/holder of premises licence.
- 9) No customers apparently carrying open bottles upon entry shall be admitted to the premises at any times the premises are open to the public
- 10) Where CCTV is installed with recording facilities such recordings shall be retained for a period of 30 days and made available within a reasonable time upon request from the police.
- 11) Alcoholic and other drinks may not be removed from the premises in open containers save for consumption in any external area provided for that purpose.
- 12) The maximum occupancy of the building (including staff and performers) will be restricted to 200 persons.
- 13) Children under the age of 16 shall not be permitted to enter the premises after 21:00.
- 14) Noise or vibration shall not emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance to nearby properties
