Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions (as specified in Section 19 of the Act)

- (1) If this premises licence authorises the supply/sale of alcohol, the following two conditions apply:
 - i. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence at any time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or at a time when the designated supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
 - ii. Every supply/sale of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence
- (2) If this Premise licence authorises the exhibition of film(s), the admission of children under the age of 18 years is restricted in accordance with the age restrictions of the British Board of Film Classification (BBFC) or authority designated under Section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984.
- (3) If this premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity (as defined by the Private Security Industry Act 2001) then such individuals must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- (1) Embedded restrictions under the Licensing Act 1964, Cinematograph (Safety) Regulations 1955 and the Children & Young Persons Act 1933 are removed from this licence.
- (2) To maintain membership of the local pubwatch scheme or similar.
- (3) Children under the age of 14 will not be permitted to remain in the premises after 21:00
- (4) If any film is shown that has not been previously broadcast before 20:00 hours on television, it will be subject to an appropriate age classification and children under the appropriate age will not be permitted in the premises when the film is shown

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

- (1) The use of outside facilities shall cease at 22:00
- (2) All doors and windows, including the kitchen shall be kept shut at all times that; regulated entertainment is taking place except as required for access or escape in emergency.
- (3) Prominent, clear and legible signage shall be displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the right of local residents to a peaceful night and to leave the premises and the area quietly. Announcements to the same effect shall be made to the patrons within the premises at appropriate times.
