

1. Purpose

To provide information about the latest (2013) mid-year estimates from the Office for National Statistics (ONS)

2. Background

The Office for National Statistics produces population estimates by regions, counties, unitary authorities and county districts in England every year. It includes the number people by age group and gender. The latest data is for 2013 and was released in June 2014.

3. Key Points

- 108,971 people were estimated to be living in Crawley in 2013.
- The population of Crawley increased by 2,374 since the Census in 2011. This represents a percentage increase in population of 2.2% since 2011.
- Crawley had the highest percentage of 25-39 year olds (24.6% of its overall population) compared to other districts in West Sussex. This shows a very slight decrease of 0.1% of this age range since the 2011 census.
- Comparatively, the estimated percentage of those who were between 25-39 years old in West Sussex in 2013 was 17%; compared to 19.9% in England.
- It is estimated that the percentage of those between the ages of 64-74 years old in Crawley was 6.5%. By comparison, West Sussex had an estimated 11.2% for this age range in 2013.
- Crawley had a slightly higher estimated percentage of females (50.4%) to males (49.6%). Similarly, West Sussex had a slightly higher proportion of females (51.5%) compared to males (48.5%).

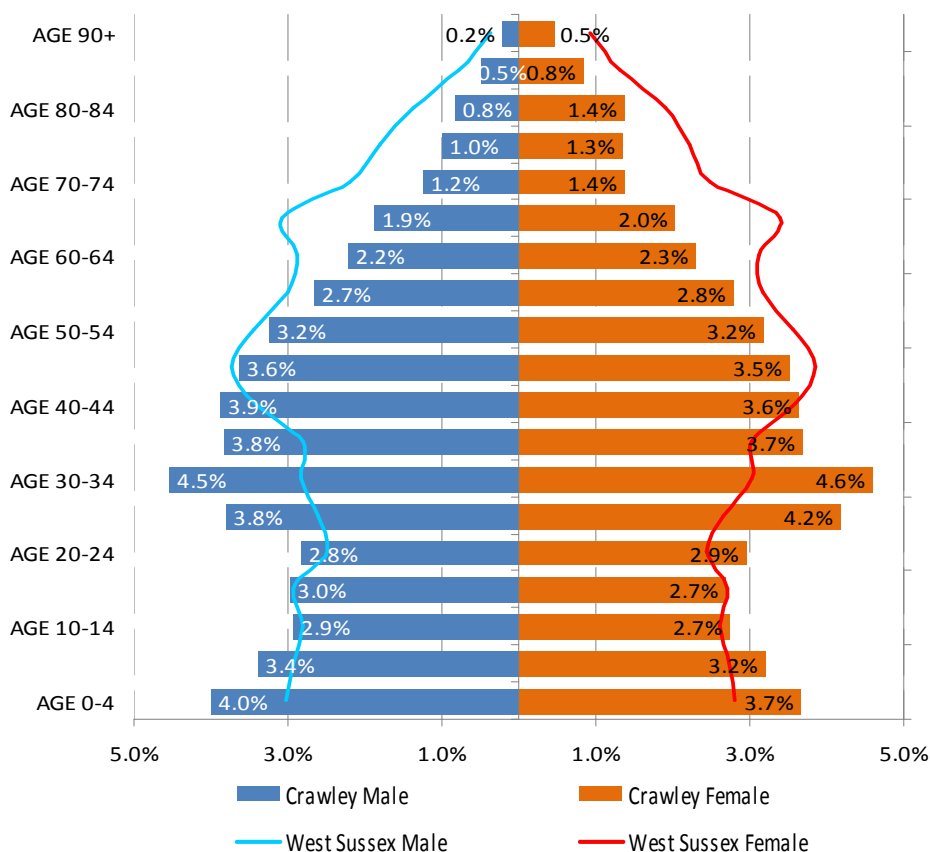


Fig 1. The chart opposite shows the estimated 2013 percentage (%) of males to females in Crawley, compared to West Sussex.
